## **Education, Scholarship and Family**

The following highlights some of the programs offered through the Iota Phi Chapter and Iota Phi Foundation. In addition, we also have a mentoring program for African-American male youth, a talent hunt search for both male and female youth, a financial literacy program for parents, and others.

Carter G. Woodson Academy is a 6-week academy is designed to be a culturally relevant experience that offers parents and children an opportunity to see themselves through the lenses of a more accurate and more holistic depiction of history, particularly one that includes the contributions of members of the African Diaspora. (February-March)



Historical Black College Tour - Since its inception over 2,000 high school juniors from the Pittsburgh area have visited 14 HBCU's annually, including Tennessee State, Fisk, Tuskegee, Norfolk State, Hampton, Virginia State, Howard, Spelman, Morehouse, and South Carolina State. Approximately 44% of the students who go on the tour enroll at an HBCU. (Spring)



Thanksgiving Baskets Program has grown to provide over 400 complete meals (turkeys and all the trimmings) each year to families throughout Larimer and the City of Pittsburgh.



Scholarship Program provides scholarships each school year to deserving African-American high school graduating seniors. Since 1984, over 175 young African-American men and women have received scholarships totaling more than \$350,000.



Christmas Toy Give-Away party has been held at our Community Center for over 25 years. Since its creation, over 6,250 children have benefited from the gift of toys, treats, books, and photos with Santa. to hundreds of children.



Crispy Tour is an annual event where members of the lota Phi chapter collaborate with professional barbers to provide free haircuts and free backpacks to males K-12. In this setting, advice is provided on how to respond to the police and other authorities in addition to general mentoring. (August)
